


POSTER ABSTRACT























PODCASTS IN THE CLASSROOM

Pedagogy...Podagagy!

- Harnessing the 'net-generation' of 'digitally-native' students with increased mass ownership of mobile-(Maag, 2009. Preskey, 2001)
- Podcasts, especially those produced through educational institutions have the power to focus attention and assist language learners to acquire useful language content.
 - (Bishop, Amankwatia & Cates, 2008)
- Podcasts can be highly beneficial to secondary language acquisition when the podcast materials are thoughtfully integrated with a clear purpose and rationale for its implementation.
- The effectiveness of podcasts is that they can provide authentic materials, (vocabulary, syntax & intonation) whilst at the same time providing students control as to how, when and where they access (Selwood, 2012) the materials they listen to.

The Future is Mobile!

- 2013 Smartphones overtook Feature Phones in world-wide sales figures for the first time.
 (BBC News Website, 15th August 2013)
- 2013 represents an increase of 46.5% of Smartphones sold compared to 2012. Feature Phone sales are down 21% from 2012.
- 2013 A survey of 320 1st & 2nd year students conducted at a national university in Japan
- 92% (294/320) owned a Smartphone.
- An increase of 35% on the 2012 survey and 61% on the 2011 survey results.
- 46% of students listen to podcasts through their Smartphone.

- To encourage students to use mobile-devices to assist with the learning process inside & outside of the classroom.

1 x 90 mins / 15 classes / 1 semester course.

 * 2 x 2nd year classes of non-English majors. Total number of students: 61 (34 male / 27 female).

Mixed ability, mixed motivation.




