An Island Alone in the Ocean

- Tristan da Cunha, or TDC, is the remotest island in the world. It is located in the South Atlantic Ocean 2,816 km (1,749 miles) from South Africa. The island is a circular shape with a diameter of about 10 km. It is a very windy place and it rains a lot, so big storms are common. The highest ever temperature recorded on the island is only 25 degrees Celsius.
- Tristan da Cunha was discovered in 1506 by a Portuguese explorer, Tristao da Cunha. However he didn't land on the island and so the first person to live on TDC was an American Captain Jonathan Lambert in 1811. Unfortunately he died in a boating accident only one year later. In 1816 the United Kingdom annexed the island and it became an official British colony. The first family to live on TDC was William Glass, his wife, four children and two servants.
- There is only one town on the island called Edinburgh after the visit of the Duke of Edinburgh in 1867. Between 1909 and 1919 no ships visited the island, but during World War II the British Navy used the island as a secret radio station. In 1961 the island's volcano forced all the islanders to leave the island, although most of them returned in 1963.
- Although a small island, TDC has all modern conveniences including a post office, supermarket, swimming pool, satellite TV and broadband Internet. The island's post code is TDC 1ZZ, cars drive on the left and the currency is Pound Sterling. English is the official language and popular sports include football, rugby and cricket.
- Tristan da Cunha is self-supporting economy with most of the islanders having jobs connected to farming and fishing. The biggest industry on TDC is the lobster factory, but the island's unique stamps and coins are also very popular around the world.

The island has many types of animals including, birds, turtles, seals, crayfish, seagulls, dogs, cats and rats. The island is also home to the smallest penguin in the world - the Rockhopper Penguin. Every May the islanders celebrate Ratting Day, where the kill as many rats as they can find.

Hollywood's Biggest Ever Premiere

- A long time ago in a galaxy far, far away...Star Wars. First seen in 1977 with the release of **A New Hope** the Star Wars franchise has generated billions of Euros and entertained millions of fans for nearly 40 years. After a ten year hiatus the latest film in the Star Wars franchise **The Force Awakens** has been released this week...and the world has been waiting.
- The premiere of the seventh Star Wars movie was held at *Grauman's Chinese Theatre* in Los Angeles. The stars, writers and director of the new movie were all in attendance including the three main stars from the first three Star Wars movies Harrison Ford, Carrie Fisher and Mark Hamill. Also in attendance were the only two actors to have been in all seven movies, Anthony Daniels who plays C3PO and Kenny Baker who performs as R2-D2.

These characters will be developed over the next three films in the franchise as two more Star Wars films are planned to be released in the next 6 years.

The film cost around €182 million to make and filming locations included England, Iceland, Ireland and Abu Dhabi. It seems that the Star Wars phenomenon is about to take-off again. So has the *Force* awoken in you…?


